### SCIP Database

The SCIP database has been established in accordance with the requirements of Article 9(1)(i) of the Waste framework Directive (WFD), which requires any supplier of an article to provide information on the presence of substances of high concern (SVHC).

Companies supplying articles containing substances of very high concern (SVHCs) on the Candidate List in a concentration above 0.1% weight by weight (w/w) on the EU market have to submit information on these articles to ECHA, as from 5 January 2021. The SCIP database ensures that the information on articles containing Candidate List substances is available throughout the whole lifecycle of products and materials, including at the waste stage. The information in the database is then made available to waste operators and consumers.

### Timescales

The ECHA notification portal will go live in October 2020. Notifications a legal requirement from 5 January 2021.

### Who Should Attend?

This module is aimed at those taking on responsibilities for the notifications of SVHC's in articles and complex objects to ECHA. Companies who produce, assemble, import or distribute articles, that contain above 0.1% weight by weight of a substance of very high concern (SVHC) Candidate List Substance will need to make a notification to the SCIP database.

## What You Will Learn

This module aims to provide practical information on how to complete SCIP notifications.

## EU Brexit

The requirement to notify to the SCIP database will still be a legal requirement in the EU. It is likely that UK will not adopt the new requirement.

## Module Tutor

This module will be presented by Caroline Raine. Caroline is a chemical legislation expert, with experience of interpreting and implementing EU legislation relating to hazardous chemicals. The knowledge Caroline has of legislation is wide ranging, covering both supply and transport legislation. Caroline has been participating in working groups with ECHA and has an excellent understanding of the forthcoming requirements. Caroline is also a Council member of the CHCS.

## Module Presentation

We will deliver this training using online training software, which we have used successfully for other CHCS training courses. You can use the software, free-of-charge on Windows, Macs, smartphones and tablets.

The workshop will run live and delegates can interact with the tutor and other delegates using their device microphone. The tutor will use a PowerPoint presentation, just as they would in face-to-face training.
